Stunning View

Immerse yourself in the abundant nature here in Otsuchi.

Otsuchi is blessed with the ocean and mountains. Feel the lush forests, crystal-clear spring water, and the pleasant ocean breeze.



Horaijima Island

Floating in Otsuchi Bay is Horaijima Island. The locals call it Hyotanajima (gourd island). Its red lighthouse was damaged by the 3.11 tsunami and rebuilt later.

What is the Sanriku Geopark?

The Sanriku coast is a geologically valuable region. This is one of the largest geoparks in Japan, covering municipalities on Iwate's coast, Hachinohe in Aomori, and Kesennuma in Miyagi and was created to show the traces of the Great East Japan Earthquake along with the beauty of the wild landscape.



Spring Water



Gensui River (spring water) and three-spined stickleback habitat

Spring water from various parts of the town have been used for domestic water since ancient times, as they are located near the sea but contain no salt. It is an asset that continues to protect the lives of the locals.



Namiita Beach

Located on the rias coast of Sanriku, Namiita Beach is famous for not having receding waves. It is characterized by calm water and loved by a wide range of people from families to surfers.

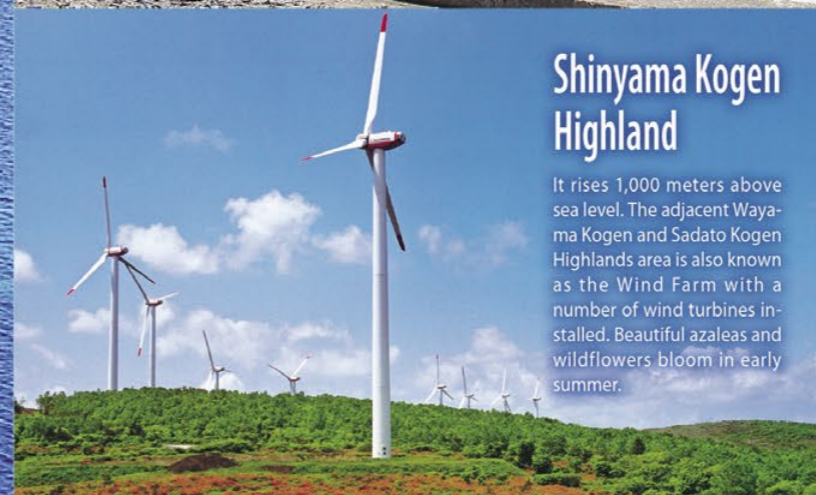


Namiita Beach Village

The beach has an area lined with small shops. Facing the beautiful sea of Sanriku, the warmth of the people of Otsuchi creates a care-free atmosphere.

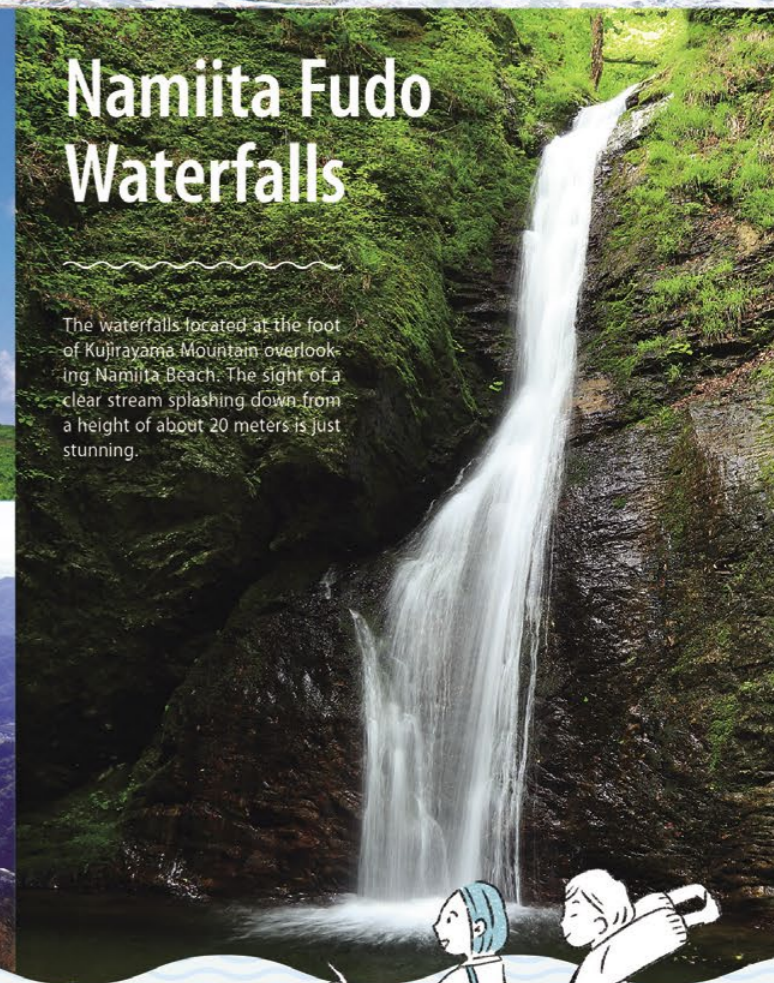
Shinyama Kogen Highland

It rises 1,000 meters above sea level. The adjacent Wayama Kogen and Sadato Kogen Highlands area is also known as the Wind Farm with a number of wind turbines installed. Beautiful azaleas and wildflowers bloom in early summer.



Namiita Fudo Waterfalls

The waterfalls located at the foot of Kujirayama Mountain overlooking Namiita Beach. The sight of a clear stream splashing down from a height of about 20 meters is just stunning.



Mt. Kujirayama (Whale Mountain)

In the old days, when the plague was spreading here, whale meat was believed to cure the disease. People gathered at the foot of this mountain in search of whales washed on the beach, hence the name Whale Mountain.



Three-spined stickleback

Freshwater fish designated as a protected species in the town. There are also anadromous types that normally live at sea and migrate upstream during spawning season. After the 3.11 tsunami, cross-breeding has increased, and recently species with both characteristics have been found.



Michinoku Coastal Trail

Discovery. Adventure. Explore Otsuchi on foot.

The long trail extending from Aomori to Fukushima gives us meaningful time to be in touch with nature and with ourselves.

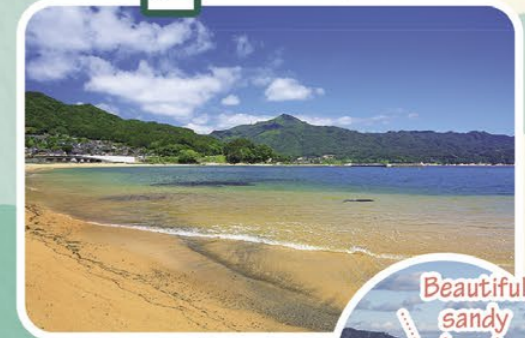
Trail Style!

1 Namiita Beach



The sandy beach is known for waves from the sea not receding after hitting the shore. Reconstruction of the sandy beach is underway after the sand ran off in the Great East Japan Earthquake.

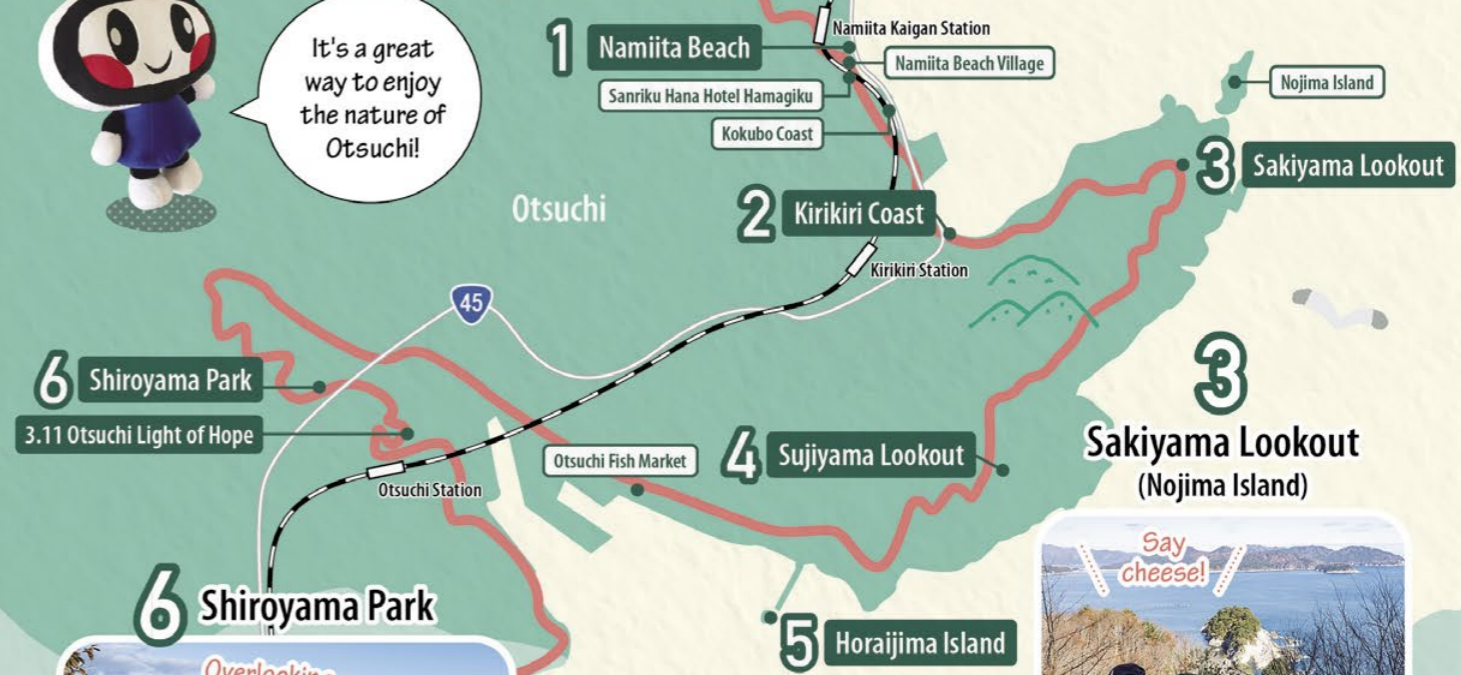
2 Kirikiri Coast



Some say the name "Kirikiri" comes from the Ainu word "Kirikiri," meaning "white sandy beach," or is because of the sound it makes when walking on the sand.

6 Shiroyama Park



Overlooking the town it was fun!

A park built on a mountain castle site from the 14th century. It is loved by the locals as a scenic spot with a panoramic view of the town, and for cherry blossoms in the spring. The "Otsuchi Light of Hope" is placed here carrying the message from Kobe that also suffered a devastating earthquake.

3 Sakiyama Lookout



The lookout provides a panoramic view of the Pacific Ocean from Namiita Beach to Funakoshi Bay, with a view of Nojima Island below. Since it faces the Rias Scenic Line, many people stop by for a break in their drive.

5 Horaijima Island



Tiny little uninhabited island!

A small island floating in Otsuchi Bay with a circumference of 200 meters and designated as a geo-site for its geological features. The island is basically granite made of magma that cooled and hardened around 120 million years.

4 Sujiyama Lookout



A resting point at the top of the 205-meter-high Sujiyama Mountain. There are trails surrounded by forests, rest areas, recreational areas, etc., and the Sujiyama Lookout overlooks the Pacific Ocean on the outside of Otsuchi Bay.

Kanezawa Goldmine



Since ancient times, the Kanezawa district has been gold panning, and its name means "gold-bearing streams." In the vicinity of Fukidanamori, there are still remains of a gold refinery and a water mill.

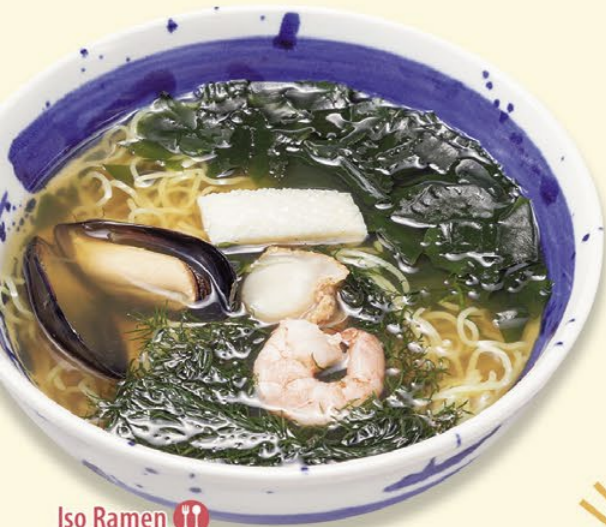

Iso Ramen, which started at a roadside restaurant in Otsuchi in the 1960s features clear, lightly salted seafood soup that is so flavorful that you want to drink it all. Each restaurant has its own flavor.



Aramaki Salmon

Wild salmon dried and salted in cold air to bring out the flavor.

The origin goes back to over 400 years ago when Otsuchi Magohachiro Masasada, the lord of Otsuchi, salted indigenous salmon returning to the river and dried it in the cold air to ship to the capital. A wide range of Aramaki Salmon is available from a whole fish to give as a New Year's celebration to fillets to suit your lifestyle.

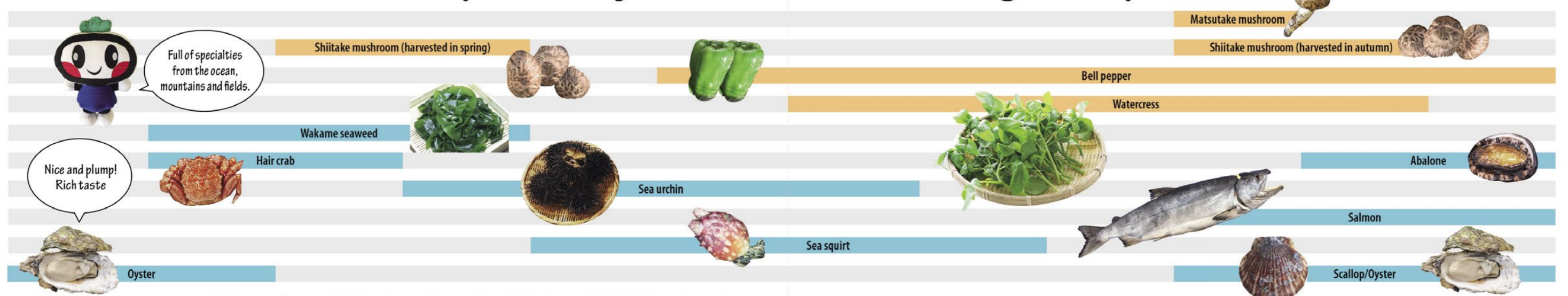

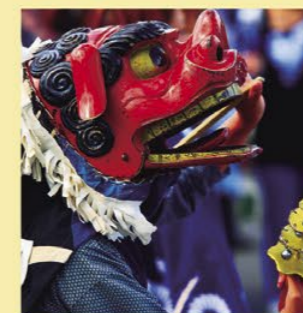

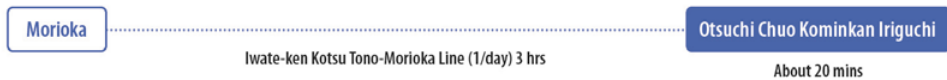
